STUDY INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SHEET OF PLAY AND SING WITH O

To work with this sheet you must learn the preparatory o passo for the compound o passo and the compound o passo.

Remember

- The sheet is useless without o passo.
- The quality of the movement is essential in any exercise proposed here.

Do the following sequence in all rhythms:

- 1 Speak the gan ("numbers" and "o"s).
- 2 Sing the gan (with "din" and "don").
- 3 Speak the atabaque ("numbers" and "o"s).
- 4 Play the atabaque with bass and treble claps.
- 5 Sing the gan while playing the atabaque.

Note: Use the O Passo exercise "Rhythm step by step" to simplify this final phase (playing and singing at the same time). Do only what is in the first beat, and keeping O Passo, add the elements one by one. Wait to add the following element until your familiarized with the previous ones.

Codes

- On gans, the lines over the "numbers" and "o"s indicate a treble sound, "din", for example; the lines under the "numbers", "e"s and "i"s indicate a bass sound, "don", for example.
- On atabaques, when the elements are marked by a line, it indicates a treble clap; when the elements are not marked, it indicates a bass clap.
